Packed lunches and Snacks

We are pleased that so many children bring healthy packed lunches and mid-morning snacks to school. However, there are a number of children bringing in chocolate bars & sweets. We request that these treats are kept for outside of school & snacks such as fruit, vegetables & crackers are provided. Please note that children from Foundation 1 to Year 2 receive free fruit and/or vegetable snacks everyday, so there is no need to send something extra in.

Celebrations - Cakes and Sweets

We can no longer allow cakes, sweets and other treats to be brought into school for birthdays and other celebrations. This is due to the number of children in school with allergies and other dietary requirements. We appreciate this may be disappointing, but hope that you will support our decision.

ScholarPack App

If you haven't yet downloaded our ScholarPack app, you can find it in the Apple or Google Play Stores. We use the app as our main method of communication. Parents and carers can also message school, report absences and update your child's consents. Contact the school office for a link up code to get connected.

Pupils with Injuries

If your child has an injury but can still attend school, please contact the school office **beforehand** so that we can ensure that the appropriate risk assessment is prepared

School Milk

Our new provider, Cool Milk, will be delivering from Monday 2nd October. We apologise for the interruption to our milk provision, but this was due to the supplier going out of business. All pupils under 5 years of age and/or entitled to free school meals automatically receive milk every day. If you would like to pay for your child to have milk, please visit coolmilk.com

We will be sending home data collection forms next week for you to check and complete. Please return these either in your child's school bag, or direct to the school office.



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
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CURRICULUM SPOTLIGHT

Maths Update

The children have been busy exploring and learning all about place value in maths this month. Using our school's approach of Concrete, Pictorial and Abstract (CPA), children have been manipulating counters, Base-10 and Rekenreks (ask your child's teacher about these!) in order those make valuable connections that make maths easier to understand for all pupils.

Children in EYFS have been busy exploring numbers and recognising pattern up to 20.



Throughout Key Stages 1 and 2, children have been starting their days with daily basic skills practice to really sharpen their understanding of the four operations.

New to Park this year is the 'Mastering Number Programme' in F2 and KS1 where children are getting to grips with Rekenreks in order to develop a solid understanding of number.

Year 6 Evolution Workshop



On Thursday, Year 6 took part in an evolution workshop with Hi-impact.

We discussed Charles Darwin's journey to the Galapagos Islands and the variety of birds he found there.

Using a range of equipment, we tested which beaks would be best suited to picking up different types of food. This helped us to understand the process of natural selection and how animals who are better suited to their environment will survive.
